

CHANGING FORMS OF GLOBAL GOVERNANCE: A DATABASE

A NOTE TO THOSE VISITING THIS DATABASE

This database provides a catalogue of material that relates to the dynamics of global social, political and economic change. It also incorporates material that helps place both globalisation and governance within an evolutionary framework centred on notions of challenge, response and threshold.

It represents the basic store of material utilized by Joseph Camilleri in his most recent collaboration with Jim Falk. This research will culminate in a book (due for publication in late 2005) examining the challenge of globalisation for governance, and institutional and normative responses to that challenge.
